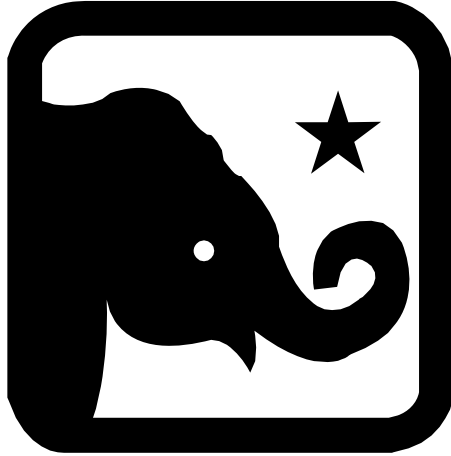

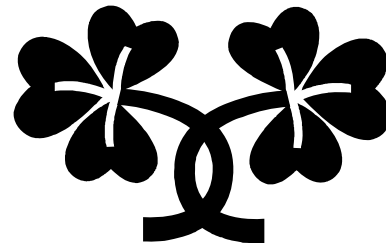
The Everything American Government Book: From the Constitution to Present-Day Elections, All You Need to Understand Our Democratic System
